Year 6 Spring Curriculum Letter

Happy New Year!

We have completed our first term as year 6s and we are all very well settled into the top of the school. However, the fun has only just begun...

English

Our first unit of work for the spring term will be based around the poem 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. We will be learning the story of Bess and The Highwayman and using it to inspire our own writing. In guided reading, we will be enjoying 'Holes' and 'There's A Boy In The Girl's Bathroom', both by Louis Sachar. We will also be undertaking some writing using these texts as a stimulus.

Maths

The spring term will consist of revisiting and practising all our maths skills. We will do this through continued fluency and problem solving. We will continue to practise our arithmetic skills daily in preparation for SATs. The year 6 teachers can't stress enough how important it is for children to be practising their times tables every day in order that children can use these skills to be able to solve a variety of other problems and calculations.

Science

In science this half term, we will be understanding how electrical circuits work. This will be followed by experiments to do with sound: finding out how sound is made and how it travels as well as how pitch and volume can be changed.

Other subjects

The year 6 curriculum is bursting at the seams! There is still so much more to look forward to! From our design technology textile unit, to thinking about the decisions we might have to make when we are older, the children will have so much to tell you about!
